


Perimeter Manufacturing: Our newest tenant plans to be in production soon. They will produce parts for solar panels for use in new and retrofit applications.

CLSCC Learning Lab: Instructional lab for teaching the process for producing alternative fuels. Utilizes waste vegetable oil to produce bio-diesel that is used in campus equipment, reducing campus annual fuel consumption.





Air Tight





- Served 93 companies (graduates).
- Currently serves 30 resident companies at CBBI and 4 at CBIC.
- Graduate companies have created over 265 jobs.
- Resident companies employ over 165 people (Total of over 430 jobs).
- Has been 100% occupied for over 10 years (opened in 2000).
- Has operated independently without any private donations or government funding since opening...completely self-sustaining.
- Approximately 85% of all the companies ever served by the Incubator are still in business today.
- Only 7 of the companies the Incubator has served have moved out-of-state after graduating. 97% of all the graduates are still in Bradley County and surrounding areas.
- CBBI is approached an average of 6 times per year by other communities wishing to start an Incubator or improve their existing incubator.
- CBBI is a member of the National Business Incubation Association (NBIA).
- CBBI has established a scholarship through our host college for Incubator employees and family.
- Working with local banks, CBBI has one of the only tenant micro-loan funds in the south east.
